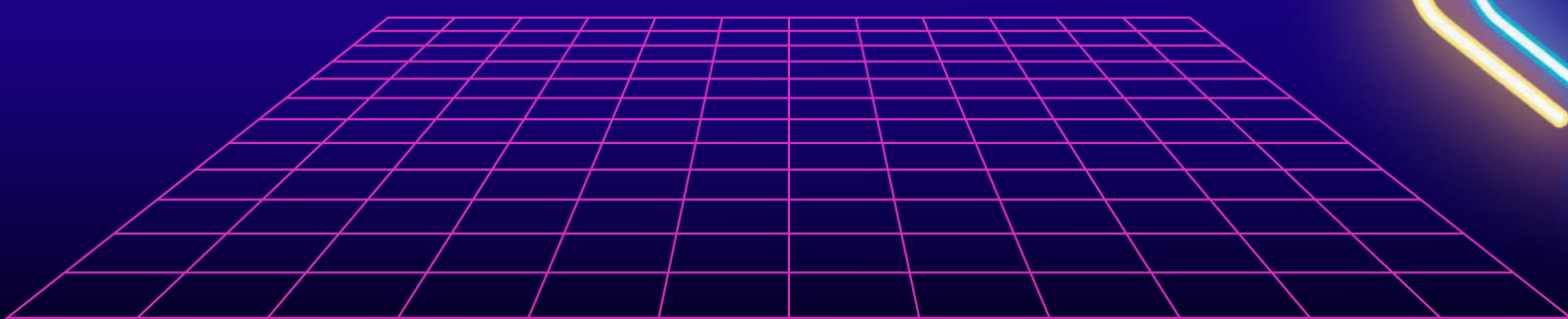

WOODPECKER *SOTO ISLAND*



‘Wenceslao’ watches over you from a height of 6.5 metres. Made of iron with a copper crest, he’s one of the sculptures on the *Emboscado Art Route*.

This bird uses its powerful beak to hunt for larvae beneath the wood – and your next clue is also made of wood.

STOP - 3

Look for two tools that leave coloured marks upon paper.

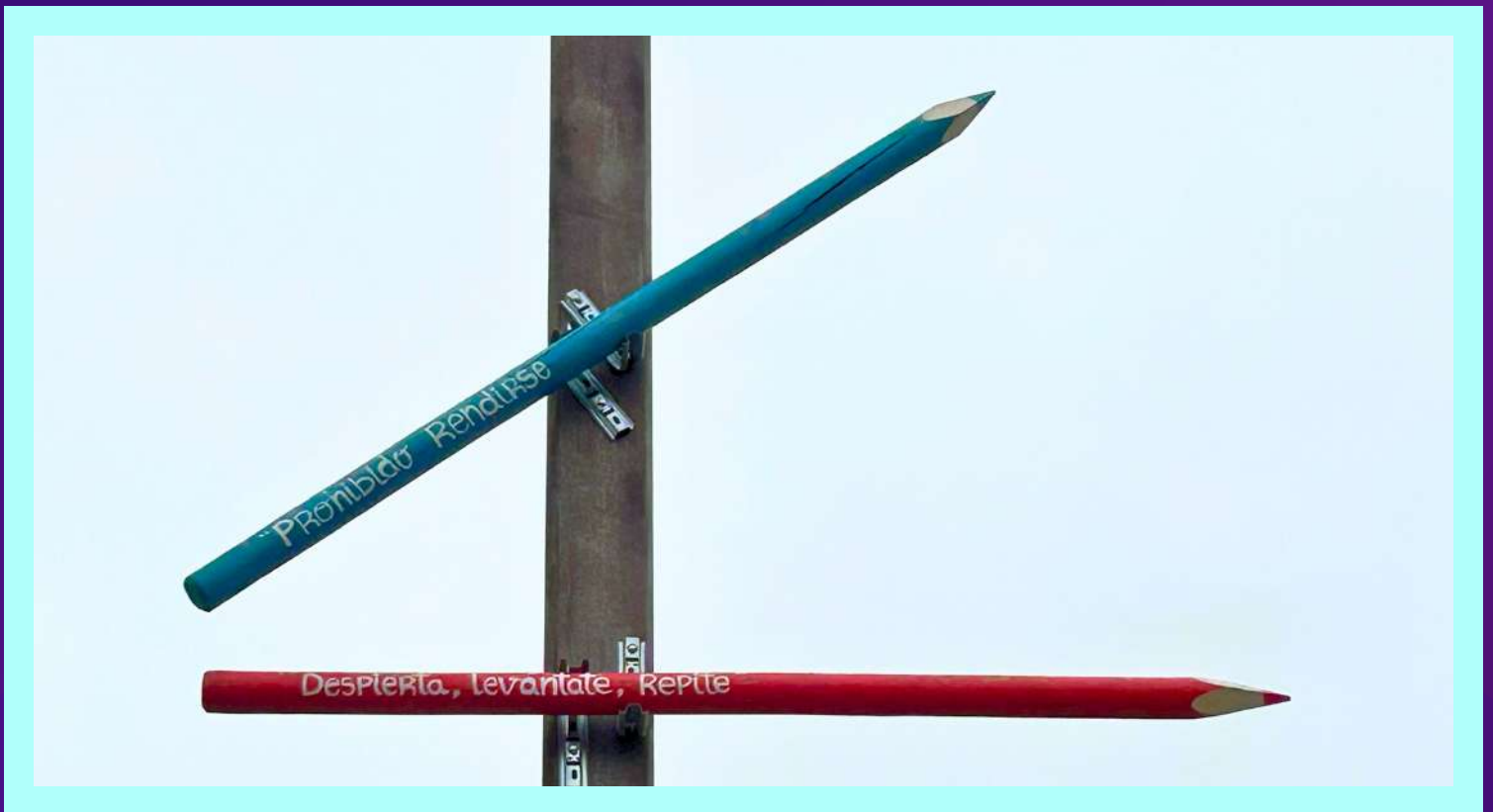
They are raised high in the air, under an artificial light that shines, every night, at the entrance to the Soto.



COLOURED PENCILS



FOOTBRIDGE TO THE SOTO *BY LA PLAZA DE LA IGLESIA*



Perched high atop a lamppost, two coloured pencils point to the east.

One says: *“Wake up, get up, repeat.”*

Remember its colour... it's the key to your next destination.

STOP - 4

From flower to flower

BUTTERFLY *PLAZA DE ESPAÑA*



The red butterfly resting on the Town Hall, with its simple geometric shapes, is one of the sculptures along *The Bugs Route*.

Here you'll also find a square immortalised in spray paint. Your next clue is waiting, painted on a wall...

MURAL 'WOMAN, HISTORY AND COMMUNITY' *PLAZA DE ESPAÑA*



This mural pays tribute to the women of Santa Marta, who sustained local trade and community life.

Among familiar houses and shops like Bar La Esquinita, Lechería Carrero or Ferretería Chacón, a kite takes flight.

STOP - 6

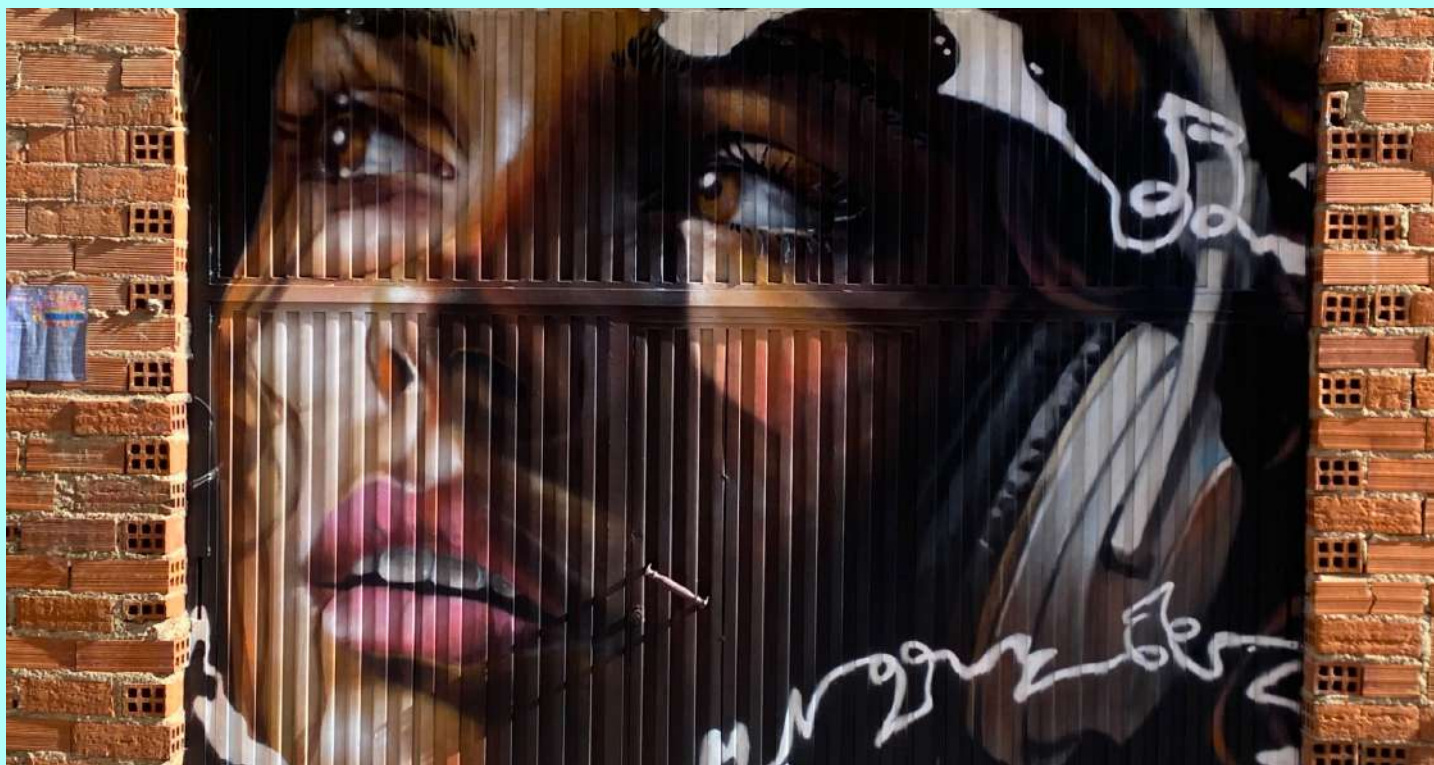
Through painted garages,

NEGO GRAFFITI

FÉLIX DE MONTEMAR STREET



A striking close-up of a woman's face – vividly painted, hyper-realistic, and lost in the rhythm of her music – is one of the award-winning murals from the first edition of *Santa Marta's Urban Art Festival*.

NEXT

STOP - 7

An old and much-loved game once called “Chapulín de carambolas” [literally, ‘The Trick-shot Grasshopper’] is known today by another name. If you can work it out, you’ll know where to go next! A clue: it involves hitting balls with sticks, on a table...





POOL BALLS

SAN BLAS ROUNDABOUT



In Santa Marta, the game of billiards leaves the tables and takes to the streets.

Seven smooth and striped spheres – each the size of a basketball – pay tribute to the old “Chapulín de carambolas”. Remember the number of the black ball – it’s the key to your final clue!

NEXT

STOP - 8

Take the number of the black pool ball and cut it in half – that's how many stingrays you'll need to find.

In a slice of ocean captured between walls, you'll spot them in the tunnel.





‘OCEAN’ MURAL SANTIAGO MIRAT PASSAGE



A burst of light and colour brings this passageway to life.

A multitude of sea creatures – including four stingrays – and marine plants fill the wall in this vibrant mural called “Ocean”.
